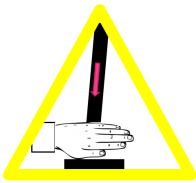
Areas of application

Only instructed persons may operate the power-operated gates.
In addition, the operating instructions of the manufacturer must be observed.

Hazards

Risk of injury in the range of movement of the gate

Risk of injury due to improper use or unintentional gate movements of the power-operated gates
(Risk of being trapped, crushed, sheared, cut, drawn in, caught, tripped or struck)



Protective measures and rules of conduct

- The operating instructions (operating manual) of the manufacturer must be strictly observed.
- The operators of the power operated gate (machine) must be instructed.
- Operational safety must be guaranteed in every operating condition.
- Safety, protective, signalling and warning devices must not be removed or manipulated.
- Ensure that the range of movement of the gate is always kept clear and that there are no persons (children playing) or objects in the range of movement of the gate during its operation.
- Only open/close the gate if you have a clear view of the range of movement of the gate.
- Remote-controlled gates may only be approached after the gate has reached its final position.
- Fasten control units at a height of ≥ 1.5 m, out of reach of children.
- In the event of a power failure, the gate can be opened using the emergency release.
- Ensure that your power-operated gate is regularly tested and serviced and that the safety, protective, signalling and warning devices are checked.

How to act in the event of faults

- Operation must be stopped immediately in the event of identifiable faults or hazards.
- Secure the power-operated gate against unauthorised use.
- Maintenance and repairs must only be carried out by an expert (specialist company).

How to act in the event of accidents



- Keep calm!
- Initiate first aid measures, secure accident site
- Report the accident, call the emergency services: 112
